#### Cooperation with other public bodies: Duty to co-operate

In order to effectively plan for minerals and waste, Worcestershire County Council needs to co-operate with other planning authorities and public bodies at a regional and national level. The Localism Act 2011 formalised and extended this good practice as a requirement in the plan making process known as the 'duty to co-operate' through Section 33A of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004.

This duty requires local planning authorities to co-operate with other planning authorities and prescribed bodies

The **West Midlands Aggregates Working Party (WM AWP)** which is supported by government and includes industry representatives. The group provides expert technical advice, provides scrutiny of and advice on the preparation of local aggregate assessments (LAA), and assesses the overall demand and supply of aggregates in the West Midlands.

The West Midlands Mineral Planning Authorities Non-Aggregate Minerals Discussion Group which meets informally to discuss cross-boundary issues for non-aggregate minerals.

#### Formal consultation activities on mineral and waste matters

Public consultation was undertaken as part of the preparation of the Minerals Local Plan from 14<sup>th</sup> July 2015 to 25<sup>th</sup> September 2015. Late responses were accepted until 27<sup>th</sup> November 2015 to accommodate late responses from statutory consultees, landowners and the mineral industry.<sup>4</sup>

A consultation newsletter was produced which included:

A second call for sites providing an opportunity to propose sites for working any type of mineral in Worcestershire

A call for information on mineral resources and essential infrastructure that supports mineral working which should be safeguarded in the Plan

An opportunity to comment on the evidence base so far
